EARLY HEAD START	NURSE FAMILY PARTNERSHIP
Serves low-income, at-risk children ages birth-3 yrs. and pregnant women. Children with disabilities welcomed.  Services include: education, health, nutrition, mental health, disabilities, and parent engagement.  Services are provided weekly, are center or home-based, and are no cost to families.  All children receive health, dental, and developmental screenings.	□ Serves first-time mothers under 28 weeks of pregnancy who live in Detroit and are low income.      □ Must be the mother's first live birth.      □ Home visits are provided by nurses.      □ Families are visited weekly for 1-1½ hours.      □ Nurses continue with the family until the child is two years old.
MATERNAL INFANT HEALTH PROGRAM  Promote healthy pregnancies, positive birth outcomes, and healthy infant growth and development of Medicaideligible pregnant women and infants.  Provides services by licensed social workers and nurses based on parent's needs and risks.  Mothers receive 9 home visits. Infants and their caregivers receive up to 36 visits based on their risks.	PARENTS AS TEACHERS  Serves pregnant women and families with children birth to age 5 for up to two years.  Services include: home visiting, group meetings, developmental screenings and resource connections.  Strengthens families and ensures that children are healthy.
HEALTHY FAMILIES AMERICA	6 INFANT MENTAL HEALTH
Serves mothers ages 13-24 who are prenatal or within the child's first 3 months of birth through weekly home visiting services.  Provides trained community health workers offering parent/child support, ongoing screening and assessment of families needs.	□ Provides weekly home-based therapy for expectant parents with young children up to age 6.      □ Serves Medicaid-eligible parents experiencing stress, depression, difficulty coping and behavioral challenges with their young children.      □ Designed for parents who feel their
